### Community Services (Chris Gilbreath)

- The Committee met on 12/10/24. *In attendance were Ruth Westergaard, Cynthia Logan, Jessica Jetter, Chris Gilbreath.*
- Debrief on the November KCAC meeting presentation by Kitsap County Public Health's Kari Hunter, presenting the data from the 2024 Health Assessment. It gave valuable information about various aspects of the availability and impact of health care in Kitsap County with emphasis on North Kitsap. The Committee members felt the presentation was very enlightening and the many questions indicated it was of high interest. Committee members were bewildered that today's Agenda indicates that other health related topics would not be presented until August at the earliest. Likewise, another Committee concern,Affordable Housing was in a similar position.
- As a follow-up for us, the KCAC Community Services Committee has been invited to participate in the Kitsap County Health Equity Collaborative with governmental, nonprofit, and other community representatives. The goal of the HEC is to co-create solutions to systemic inequities in Kitsap County. A member of the Community Services Committee will be attending the next meeting of the HEC and will report back.
- The remainder of the meeting was focused on our update of the Committee's Working Plan. Related to that, our effort to Improve Community Connections, in particular with the School District, designated each local school to be assigned to a committee member to help us be aware of activities and efforts in each school. A similar strategy may be employed with other community organizations including Tribal activities.
- CS's next meeting will be January 7th at 4 PM at the Village Green.

- Another area of planning involves our NK United efforts to assist the NK School District with upgrading their Sports fields and equipment. Our earlier efforts to renew the side fields at Kingston Middle School continues with plans to recondition the infields for the baseball and softball fields. Steps to ensure safe soccer goals at both secondary schools are continuing.
- As an aside, the need to be diligent and effective in our fundraising efforts are demonstrated in local grants approved today in the areas of food support and affordable housing totalling \$10,400. Member assignments were given to approach local contacts in the areas of environmental and education support. While writing this, I was interrupted by a Poulsbo Rotarian who is forwarding two requests for meeting needs at Wolfle and Gordon.
- Earlier in the day the backlogged International Committee approved grants for projects dealing with a Ugandan water project, an Afghan education effort, a Cambodian literacy project and a food support effort in Central Mexico. Not all service clubs address International needs, but Rotary is an International organization that believes in doing just that is moral and correct.

- Amendment from Chris Gilbreath: Bill Beaudoin in his final public comment-made two comments. One was about wanting a presentation by the YMCA to this council. The other was about affordable housing. Both had been on the potential meeting topics, YMCA has dropped off and affordable housing has not been scheduled.
- Betsy Cooper wants to make sure the Arborwood Developers Agreement issue (of expiry pending) is a priority. It is critical to get that information out to the public.
- Christine Rolfes introduced Elena who was sitting in the audience. She is a

sophomore and an interested future KCAC youth representative.

- Beverly Parsons wanted to introduce Community Heart & Soul. Engaging the community to more deeply engage in community efforts. It's a two year process. She's happy to share more information if KCAC is interested.
- Chris Gilbreath expressed gratitude to both Kate and Tim for their leadership.
- Steve Heacock wanted to remind people that the Port lights will be up through January this year.
