22	was adopted and tree canopy regulations also included for consideration by
23	BOCC.

35	housing diversity; encourage multi-family and missing-middle housing;
36	promote infill housing in UGA; mitigate displacement risks.

2	Climate Change and establishing foundation for meeting State climate planning
3	legislation, required by 2029; reducing greenhouse gas emissions, sea level
4	rise.

37	not to full Planning Commission.
