- 6. Maps are a snapshot
  - a. Trusting green is green, yellow is yellow, red is red, mutually. Do we want to have a dispute process or trust the ratings. Would need the formatted inputs GIS would need for layer editing. Is this even feasible (spot editing of shape files)? When keyed to a survey makes good sense to add.
  - b. Adding Wild Fish Conservancy mapping soon
  - c. ID team (County, DOE, WDFW, tribal representatives at times) official typing exercise (mainly for streams)
    - i. DNR manages these layers for us
    - ii. ID team conclusions accepted by DNR for updates
    - iii. Site Eval is the mechanism to convene the ID team
- 7. Review
  - a. Yellow same as today, a buffer. Parcel doesn't have it, the neighbor's does.
- 8. Parcel mosaic
  - a. Nightly updates
- 9. Intake checklists
- 10. Screening
  - a. No naming convention
  - b. Several pages, look like a complete set
  - c. Site plan
    - i. Based on reviewer feedback
  - d. Stormwater worksheet filled out (not blank)
    - i. Review Page 5
    - ii. Documents that back up abbreviated drainage review
  - e. Health
    - i. Right project, not expired
- 11. Talked about the sections: prerequisites, concurrent, in this application, R/Y, later
- 12. Kurt to mock up a SFR intake checklist to mark up/finalize as a group
