KITSAP COUNTY PARKS ADVISORY BOARD DRAFT February 19, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:02 PM by the Parks Advisory Board Chair, Larry Walker. Guidelines of the hybrid Parks Advisory Board Meeting were read.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION | Linda Berry Maraist motioned to adopt <u>January 15, 2025</u>, meeting minutes. Dawn Dockter seconded the motion. Dawn Dockter requested edit to sentence "*5min recess for review of Directors Report*", amended to say "*5min recess for review of PAB Workplan*". Minutes approved as amended.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- KC Patton | Kitsap Aircraft Radio Control Society -
 - Presented a model aircraft built by the EAA Young Eagles group last year. The EAA group is in the process of building another model.
 - The first Saturday of each month, April to Oct., at 10am, is competition day. The Public is welcome
- David Onstad | Port Orchard
 - Upon review of PROS Plan he discovered Appendix X is missing. It is mentioned on page 18 of the PROS Plan but is not included.
 - Table on page 48 lists stakeholders interviewed for the PROS Plan. There is no summary for the Parks Stewards interviews. There are summaries for everyone else but not for the Park Stewards.
- Request to have Appendix X and the information about Parks Stewards comments made available for review before the public comment period ends. And extend the public comment period after the missing documents are made available.

PAB member Dawn Dockter expressed thanks to Park User Group representatives for their reports and the commitment the groups have to their "part of the park.

PAB member Linda Berry Maraist announced the departure of Eric Baker. Eric worked for the Kitsap County Board of Commissioners office for 34 years. And acknowledged his contributions and impact to the Parks Department and County wide.

Also announced the final transaction of the Kitsap Forest and Bay Conservation project. Parks acquired 467 acres with the assistance of conservation futures.

PAB WORKPLAN -

PAB meeting packet included an updated draft version of the proposed PAB Workplan based on the conversations at January PAB meeting. Parks Director asked PAB to provide additional feedback.

ACTION | Dawn Dockter motioned to approve the PAB Workplan as proposed.

Linda Berry Maraist seconded the motion

Workplan was approved unanimously.

Lisa asked if there was any time or money put aside for developing the website page that would provide answers to questions asked at the PAB meetings.

Director shared that the Parks website does have a FAQs page, and he will check with staff on the updated schedule.

Capital Projects Program

Point No Point Park Beach and Shoreline Repair

The Public Works Capital Facilities Division (PW-CFD) has assumed project management. Parks remains the 'owner' of the project, but PW-CFD is providing oversight of the contracts, bidding, and construction. Some of the permits with the regulatory agencies (State of Washington's Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Ecology, US Army Corps of Engineers, US Coast Guard, and Kitsap County's Department of Community Development) have been approved, others remain under review.

Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park – North Gateway Parking Lot

The project remains in the permitting phase. A DNS was issued on November 15, 2024 for SEPA but it was appealed on December 4, 2024. A pre-hearing meeting was held on January 16, 2025 to plan out the appeal hearing details; the hearing is scheduled for March 20 and anticipated to only require one day for arguments. In early February, the parties discussed terms attempting to reach an agreement that would result with a withdrawal of the appeal. An agreement was not reached at that time, but recently the appellants notified Kitsap County they would now agree to the original terms. The appeal was officially withdrawn on March 18, 2025. A new timeline for the project is under development.

The Commissioner's Office and Parks are partnering on the implementation of 2024 Board-directed changes to the County's event support practices. Changes will be communicated to event organizers in early 2025 in close collaboration with Board members. Implementation of the changes will not take place until 2026.

Maintenance & Operations Program

Storm Cleanup

Staff and volunteer sawyers simultaneously worked to remove over 150 trees that were uprooted or fallen during the recent windstorm which caused widespread power outages across the county. The fallen trees were primarily located in Illahee Forest Heritage Park, Guillemot Cove Reserve, Island Lake Park, Fairgrounds & Events Center, Harper Park, and South Kitsap Regional Park. Staff responded quickly and efficiently, ensuring that parks and parking lots were safely cleared while volunteers focused on clearing trails. Staff then shifted their efforts to assist volunteer sawyers in removing large trees at Port Gamble Forest Heritage Park, Newberry Hill Heritage Park, Hansville Greenway, and other undeveloped parks.

Fairgrounds Buildings Repairs

E Barn Roof

The storms and rain have caused significant damage to the fair barns over the years, resulting in roof leaks, rotting walls, and gutters that cannot be replaced due to rotten fascia. The recent windstorm also tore roofing off several barns at the fairgrounds, particularly the "E" barn, which hosts many equestrian events. The patchwork additions to this barn's construction have caused water to drain inside the building instead of outside. As a result, the building requires a new roof and structural upgrades.

Water Lines

The water supply line to the President's Hall was repaired as were multiple other water line repairs needed across the Fairgrounds, including at the E Barn and Rabbit barn. New water lines were installed with PEX and PVC.

Washington Youth Academy

Crews from the Washington Youth Academy (WYA) provided valuable assistance to staff at South Kitsap Regional Park (SKRP) and Lobe ballfields by helping to prepare the fields for the upcoming season. Their efforts included hours of hand weeding and the raking warning

tracks and infields. This collaboration with WYA was a welcome addition to the early season ballfield preparations as staff had not utilized WYA for this work in recent years. Plans are being made to continue involving WYA in ballfield maintenance, especially at SKRP and Veteran's Memorial Park where baseball fields could benefit from additional hand raking.

Opening Day

Staff have been diligently preparing parks for the April 1 opening by cleaning up storm and tree debris in parks that are currently closed, refurbishing BBQs and picnic tables, dewinterizing facilities, and readying parking lots and bathrooms for visitors. The playground safety surfacing at Horseshoe Lake Park was upgraded from sand to playground chips, enhancing the safety of the aging playground. Additionally, the parking lot owned by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) on Point No Point Road was reopened on March 14. Parks has an agreement with WDFW in which Parks staff provide basic maintenance on the property, including daily checks for ground litter and restocking the bathroom with paper products, in exchange for having the lot open earlier than normal and to accommodate visitation to the area due to the Point No Point parking lot closure.

Homeless Encampment Cleanup and Staff Training

Parks staff, in collaboration with the HEART team, have been actively cleaning up abandoned sites at various locations including Illahee Forest Heritage Park, Old Mill Park, and South Kitsap Regional Park. To better learn about the challenges faced by unhoused individuals, staff participated in a "Homeless not Helpless" training session conducted by Trisha Munson of Common Street. The session was held immediately following M&O's annual Spills and Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan training. Marrying these two trainings together helped provide a comprehensive understanding of the challenges of being unhoused and resulting environmental impacts as well as empowering staff with strategies to intervene before camps are established. This "Homeless not Helpless" training abandoned encampment cleanups, Parks staff encounter various hazards including needles, drugs, bloodborne pathogens, and human waste. Staff were trained to identify and address these hazards. This comprehensive approach reflects Parks' commitment to creating a safer and more supportive environment for all park visitors.


Planning Program

Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PROS) Plan


The review and approval process for the Draft PROS Plan is scheduled to take place February - July 2025. The Draft PROS plan was released on February 10, 2025, for a fiveweek public comment period, which ended on March 16, 2025. Comments received are available for the public to review on the PROS website. The Parks Department has been recording and responding to the comments and making edits to the plan accordingly. Edits made to the plan are also being tracked and will be posted on the PROS website.

The Parks Department has also been preparing the non-project SEPA checklist for submittal to DCD for review and a Determination. Next steps for the plan include review by DCD (as mentioned above), Planning Commission, Board of County Commissioners, and Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO). An updated schedule can viewed in *Attachment B*.





ATHLETIC FIELD USAGE IN HOURS CENTRAL




ATHLETIC FIELD USAGE IN HOURS SOUTH




PICNIC SHELTER RENTAL DAYS



FAIRGROUNDS EVENT DAYS






SPECIAL PARK EVENT DAYS
